Course Title

Pole lathe turning - 2 day consolidation course

Introduction

The 'Pole Lathe' is a traditional woodworking tool used for turning 'green wood'.

Rotational power is produced by the operation of a simple foot treadle against the inherent springiness of a long pole. In action, the operator offers up a range of chisels in order to quickly and efficiently remove material. In doing so, a wide range of product can be produced from chair parts to spoons.

This kind of equipment has been used in various forms around the world for centuries. Early settlers to New Zealand used a variation of the 'Bodgers' pole lathe illustrated.



Course outline

The Consolidation course will encourage you to extend and develop your basic skills in this craft. It is best suited to those who have attended a Beginners Course but not limited by this prerequisite.

Courses detail

During this course you will:

- consolidate your understanding from the Beginners Course
- develop your confidence in using various cutting techniques
- learn to sharpen tools
- complete a personal project(s) to take away e.g. bowls or/and spoons

Skills to be developed

All courses are designed to ensure that you achieve some level of mastery with minimal instruction and maximum hands-on experience. The success of these practical courses will be as a result of the full engagement of your physical senses along with your mind. Whichever course you undertake it will be an opportunity to expand your understanding of how you process instruction.

This particular course will offer you the opportunity to develop a broad range of personal or soft skills and in addition, specifically to,

- Rediscover or acquire fine motor skills in the use of a limited range of tools and equipment,
- Develop core strength and hand-to-eye co-ordination in order to produce precision work,
- Experience the meditative effect of complete physical engagement,
- Gain an appreciation of the historic context of technology.

You will also be invited to take part in the risk assessment for any process you are involved in, highlighting specific tools and equipment as appropriate.

Assistance can be offered in this regard, please ask at the time of booking. Please ensure clothing worn is not so precious that a little dust and dirt is a problem.

I am also a qualified, secondary trained Design & Technology teacher and in the last twenty years have developed a successful career in the special needs sector.
